

# Building The World As We Want It To Be

ACT is a people's power organization working across race, socioeconomic background, faith, and geography to win on issues of justice for low- and moderate-income communities in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. We train and develop leaders to act and win on the issues that are most important to everyday people in our communities.



At the heart of our work, we **listen** to each other in one-on-one conversations, house meetings, and listening sessions. We build relationships of trust across differences. We **research** the best solutions to the problems faced in our neighborhoods. We build power and **act** together to change our communities for the better. And we **reflect** and evaluate to learn from our work and plan for the future.



## **ACT In Action**

# 2018-

ACT was launched at a Founding Assembly with over 1,100 members.



This assembly was the result of hundreds of one-on-one conversations and dozens of trainings on community organizing.

We took the time we needed to build trusting relationships and our collective power. We knew that without this intentional work, we would not have the power we need to face the scale of the problems plaguing our communities. Safe Schools Because of our work, Anne Arundel County Schools shortened their timeline to test for and remediate the presence of lead in school drinking water from 3 years down to 1.

• 2019

As a result of ACT's organizing with community partners Anne Arundel County passed **Fair Housing legislation**. This is a crucial step to prevent discrimination in housing against renters using public assistance vouchers.



ACT supported residents of **Woodside Gardens,** a publicly subsidized housing complex in Annapolis, to organize and seek accountability from their landlords for unhealthy and unsafe living conditions. As a result, the owners committed \$1M for renovations and repairs.

ACT engaged the Anne Arundel County Executive, Annapolis Mayor and police chiefs to be leaders in the Do Not Stand Idly By national movement to **reduce gun violence.** 

# 2020

Feed Anne Arundel was formed in partnership with ACT and local restaurants. In the economic crisis caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, we mobilized to support workers vulnerable to losing their livelihoods, stabilize small businesses at the core of our economy, and feed our community. We ensured 75 restaurants could pay their workers and delivered over 200,000 meals to families in Anne Arundel County.



#### **Equity in Schools**

With allies, ACT protected funding to create new school bus routes for low-income and Black students. Next, ACT ensured that every student, instead of every family, in Anne Arundel Public Schools received a laptop for online learning during the pandemic.



# 2021



### ACT brought the **Turnaround Thursday jobs movement** for returning

for returning citizens to Anne Arundel County.



The County Executive committed \$1.3M to fund the movement and Luminis Health joined to become an employer partner and anchor institution.

Learning from Turnaround Tuesday's success in Baltimore, this movement will prepare, train and connect returning citizens, unemployed, underemployed and residents to living wage jobs.

# Turnaround Thursday Anne Arundel

Hosted by our partner organization, Community Action Agency of Anne Arundel County, a full-time staff is now working to recruit and train participants. ACT is committed to working with business and government partners to identify employer partners and resources for the movement to succeed. In 2023, the first class of participants will graduate and be connected with a job with one of our employer partners.

#### **Election Accountability Actions**

Over 170 ACT members turned out for an accountability session with candidates for County Executive and County Council. The candidates heard our stories and committed to working with us to grow our jobs movement for returning citizens, Turnaround Thursday.

In partnership with our sister organizations, AIM in Montgomery County and PATH in Howard County we held actions with the statewide candidates for Governor, Attorney General, and Comptroller. Over 1,000

members attended the hybrid actions which created deep conversation and commitments to work with us on our priorities for the environment, early childhood learning, affordable housing, and the wealth gap.
